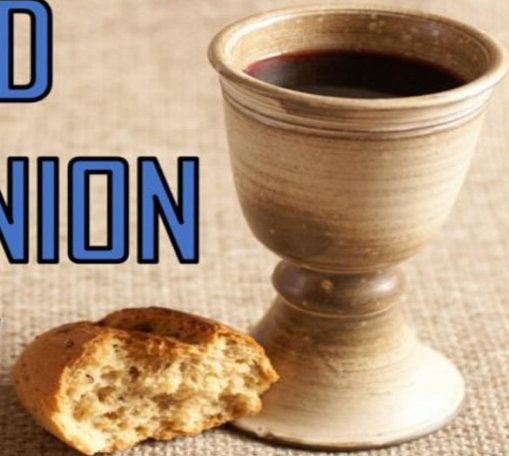

On the first Sunday in October, United Methodist congregations join many Christian churches across the globe in celebrating [World Communion Sunday](#).

World Communion Sunday began as World-Wide Communion Sunday at Shadyside Presbyterian Church in Pittsburg, Pennsylvania in 1933. The Rev. Hugh Thompson Kerr and his congregation sought to demonstrate the interconnectedness of Christian churches, regardless of denomination.

In 1940, the Federal Council of Churches of Christ in America, which included all of the predecessor denominations of The United Methodist Church, adopted World-Wide Communion Sunday. The global celebration occurs on the first Sunday in October.

Today, The United Methodist Church celebrates World Communion Sunday with congregations all over the globe. Followers of Jesus Christ in large churches and small, on farms and in cities, in ornate buildings and under tents, gather to receive the bread and cup of Holy Communion.

Despite the differences in our denominations and traditions, we celebrate our unity in Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior.

BISHOP'S APPEAL: PUERTO RICO

Bishop Bickerton is not only our resident Bishop, but the President of the Council of Bishops for our denomination and the President of UMCOR for our denomination (United Methodist Committee on Relief.) He has designated Sunday, October 16 for all of our New York Conference Churches to take a special collection. Here is what Bishop writes:

In Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands, The United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR), our primary disaster response agency, provides support for relief supplies and other commodities. They are also prepared to offer additional support through funding, training, and project development once specific needs are identified. REHACE, a nonprofit organization of the Methodist Church of Puerto Rico, has partnered with UMCOR to provide immediate response in the communities. Currently, they are organizing Centers for those displaced by the storm and community dining rooms as they continue to evaluate the needs created by the storm.

I am asking that all our congregations designate Sunday, October 16, for a special offering in support of UMCOR's and our Conference's response effort in this area. Individuals can also donate online using our webpage:

Bishop Bickerton notes that in addition to power outages, particularly on the southeastern side of the island, there are water shortages, and many roads closed due to flooding and landslides, creating supply chain issues.

In order to keep track of UMC of Lake Ronkonkoma's giving to UMCOR, we ask that you write your check to UMC of Lake Ronkonkoma and then put "UMCOR – Puerto Rico" in the memo line. We will write a check from our church to UMCOR for the total collected on October 16. If you give online, using the link above, you can designate that you are a member of this church so the total from our church is acknowledged.

We are also aware that UMCOR will be helping in the aftermath of Hurricane Ian. Watch the UMCOR website for opportunities to target additional giving to Florida and other affected areas:



Pastor Stuart Luther Baker, 83, passed away on Friday September 23, 2022, at Cornwall Manor. He was the husband of Carolyn R. Baker, with whom he celebrated 60 years in marriage.

Stuart was born in Sturgis, MI on April 6, 1939, to Luther W. and Emmy Lou Baker. He received a Master's in Theology from Yale Divinity School. Stuart had served on various committees and boards for New York Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church, and served as pastor at Fair Haven United Methodist Parish in New Haven, CT, South Meriden Trinity United Methodist Church, in South Meriden, CT, Lake Ronkonkoma United Methodist Church, on Long Island, NY, where he served for 19 years, and Stratford United Methodist Church in Stratford, CT. Stuart had taken many trips to the Holy Land and was also involved with prison ministry in the Poconos. He enjoyed traveling, hiking, walking, birdwatching, fishing, and camping.

Surviving in addition to his wife are his children, Cynthia Rothenberger and her husband John, Deborah Kelly and her husband Joseph of Tully, Stephen Baker and his wife Elena, grandchildren, Beth & Sarah Rothenberger, Matthew, Brian & Eleanor Kelly, Stella & Summer Baker, and his siblings, Neal Baker & Annette Ingraham of Thibodaux, LA.



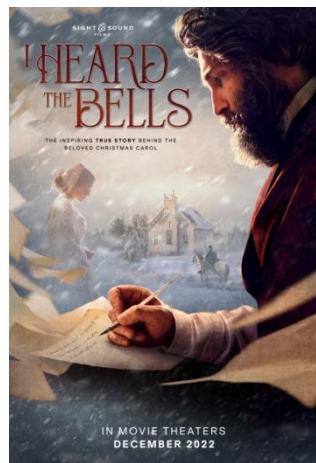
The "Little Brown Church" is Dedicated

The new church building was almost ready to use when the outside was covered with brown shakes and the pews were moved over from the Parish Hall. A metal ceiling was installed, painted and decorated. Woodhull N. Raynor provided the cornerstone, and Mr. & Mrs. Henry Hallock donated the bell. The Presiding Elder, Dr. Chadwick, preached the dedication sermon in the afternoon. In the evening Dr. D.W. Couch preached.

The church cost about \$3,500 to complete. At the dedication, \$1,200 was raised to finish paying the construction costs.

We will present Bibles to our third grade students this month.

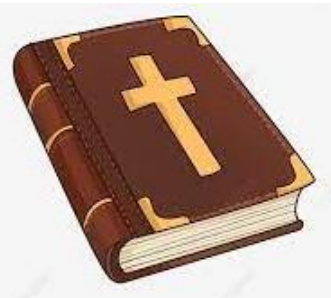
