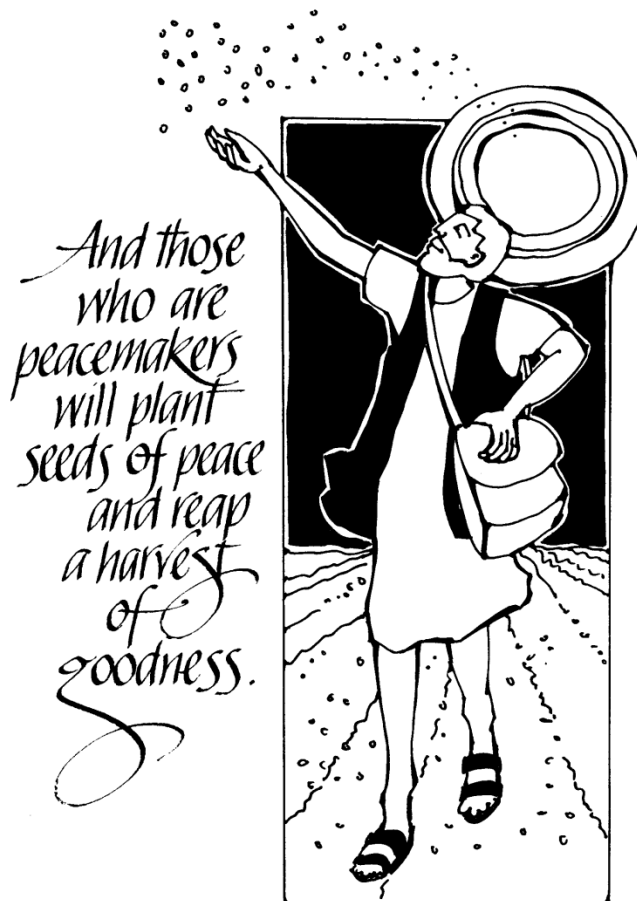

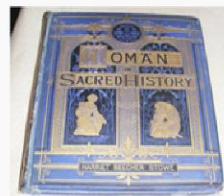

Here is a list of things to be included. We will collect them starting the first Sunday in October. You can fill your own bucket, buy some of the items or give money so we can purchase whatever we are missing. Any questions, call Jerry June at 516 458-5337.

5 gallon bucket with re-sealable lid

liquid laundry detergent - one 50 ounce or two 25 ounce only

liquid household cleaner – 12 to 16 oz. liquid that can be mixed with water - no spray cleaners

dish soap – 16 to 28 oz. bottle

1 can air freshener – aerosol or pump

1 insect repellent spray – 6 to 14 oz.

1 scrub brush – plastic or wooden handle

18 cleaning wipes – Handi Wipes or reusable wipes, no terry towels - remove from packaging

7 sponges – no cellulose sponges due to mold issues - remove from packaging

5 scouring pads – no stainless steel, Brillo, SOS pads (nothing with soap built in)

50 clothespins

clothesline – one 100 ft. or two 50 ft., cotton or plastic

24 roll of heavy-duty trash bags – 33 to 45 gallon size

5 dust masks

2 pairs kitchen dishwashing gloves – durable enough for multiple uses

1 pair work gloves – cotton with leather palm or all leather

We have found that once the congregation is educated, they are empowered to ensure personal financial wellness and, in turn, are often able to increase support of their church.

The program has a proven track record of success. District Superintendent, Rev. Betsy Ott, former pastor of Lake Ronkonkoma UMC and Park Ave. UMC said the following:

"Your program is the most positive thing going on in this conference relating to stewardship that I've seen in a long time." You're doing a wonderful job. From the Parish Nurses...

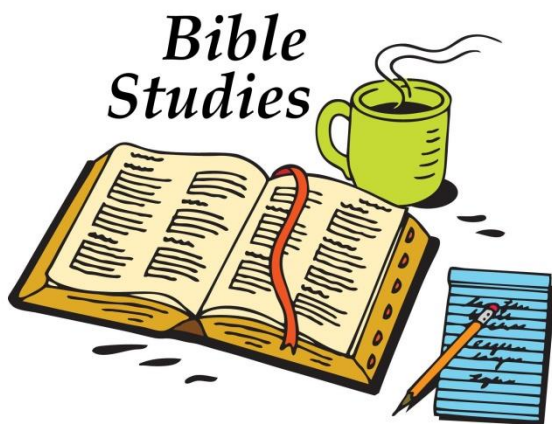
In the wake of what happened this month on Staten Island to a 13 year old boy, the Parish Nurses offer this suggestion as a life lesson to all children who will understand no matter their grade in school.

Before her daughter started middle school, Amy Gardner made sure to help her for the year ahead.

They decorated her locker, bought new uniforms and school supplies. Then her mother handed her a new tube of toothpaste and simply asked the child to squirt it all out on a plate. Once the unusual task was completed, her mom asked her to put all the toothpaste back into the tube. The little girl exclaimed that it was impossible and that the toothpaste would never be like it was before. These were her mother's words:

"You will remember this plate of toothpaste for the rest of your life. Your words have the power of life or death. As you go into middle school, you are about to see just how much weight your words carry. You are going to have the opportunity to use your words to hurt, demean, slander and wound others. You are also going to have the opportunity to use your words to heal, encourage, inspire and love others. You will occasionally make the wrong choice.....just like this toothpaste; once the words leave your mouth, you can't take them back. Use your words carefully.....when others are misusing their words, guard your words. Make the choice every morning that life-giving words will come out of your mouth. Decide tonight that you are going to be a life-giver in middle school. Be known for your gentleness and compassion. Use your life to give life to a world that so desperately needs it. You will never, ever regret choosing kindness."

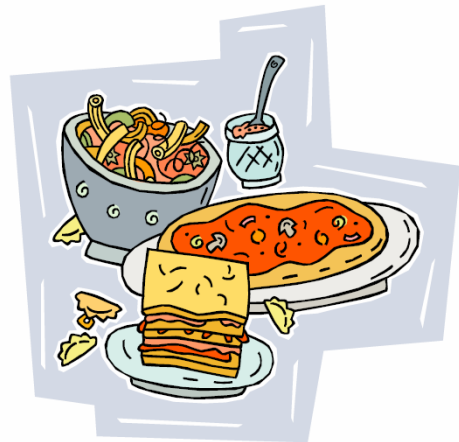

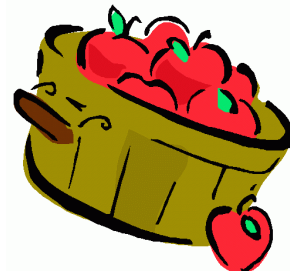
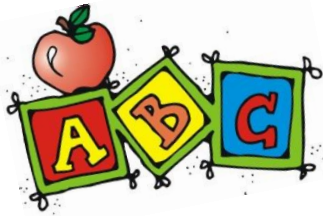
