

Spring is here. For the past several months we explored Health Screening, Exercise, and Heart Health. It is time to go outdoors and see the world we inhabit. Sunny days will soon be the norm for our community. We can explore the block on which we live and the beautiful parks and beaches. We will dust off our bikes and walking sticks. Baseballs, tennis rackets and golf clubs will come out of winter hibernation.

While we love the sun we must protect our skin from damage. Skin cancer is the most common type of cancer. The best way to prevent skin cancer is to protect your skin from the sun and sources of UV (ultraviolet) Rays.

To protect yourself from skin cancer:

- Stay out of the sun as much as possible between 10 A.M. and 4 P.M.
- Cover up with long sleeves, long pants or a long skirt, a hat and sunglasses.
- Use sunscreen with SPF-15 or higher.
- Don't use tanning machines.
- Check your skin for changes regularly.

Skin that was burnt as a child puts the adult at greater risk for skin cancer. So, get out the sunblock and encourage the youths and those you love to put on sunblock each day when they are enjoying the wonderful, sunny world we live in here on Long Island.

BEES DISTURB A FUNERAL

Unpleasant experience for the mourners in a

Long Island Church

Honeybees seriously disturbed a funeral on Tuesday in the Methodist Episcopal church at Lake Grove. Shortly after the ceremony began, bees began to fill the church. They seemed to come in hundreds first and then the air became nearly black with them. They began to fly around the heads of the mourners in a disagreeable way, then one of them stung a pall bearer in the neck.

The man flinched with pain, but, tying a handkerchief around his neck, tried to look composed. In a short time nearly everybody in church was moving handkerchiefs and hats around their heads in an effort to keep the bees away from their heads and necks.

Undertaker Charles Raynor was attacked by swarms of bees, but escaped with a few stings. The congregation was on the point of leaving the church several times. Finally, the ceremony was over and the mourners filed out. As the pallbearers left the church the bees pursued them and followed the procession quite a distance.

Undertaker Raynor, as he sat upon his seat driving the hearse, was swinging both hands in an effort to keep the bees from lighting upon his body. Down on the ground, the pall bearers were also fighting the bees. When the cemetery was reached the bees were gone and the funeral proceeded without further difleuity.

An extermination of the church building showed that bees had stowed hundreds of pounds of honey within the walls between the rafters in the loft.

Save on your Taxes

Qualified Charitable Contribution



Save on your taxes with your donation to the Lake Ronkonkoma United Methodist Church with a qualified charitable distribution (QCD). You can sell shares from your mutual funds or brokerage account to donate to a qualified charity (for which our church is one).

• A qualified charitable distribution (QCD) is not subject to ordinary federal income taxes – the amount is simply excluded from your taxable income. In general, QCDs must be reduced by deductible IRA contributions made for the year you reach age 70½ or later. If you have made deductible IRA contributions for the year you turn 70½ or later, consult a qualified tax advisor prior to taking a QCD to determine the amount by which your QCD must be reduced.

About taking a qualified charitable distribution for your required minimum distribution (RMD)

- Your QCD counts towards satisfying your RMD once you reach RMD age.
- Up to a maximum of \$100,000 of your RMD can be donated to a qualified charity.
- If you have the RMD service, be sure to factor in these donations to avoid distributing more than your annual RMD.
- Qualified charitable distributions are counted for the tax year in which they are taken.

Example.

We are required to take an RMD each year from our IRA. We request that a QCD be made to satisfy a portion of our yearly RMD. A check for the requested amount is sent to our address with the name of the church as the payee. We then give this check to the church to satisfy a portion of our gift and tithe for the year.

April Fools' Day



Some historians speculate that April Fools' Day dates back to 1582, when France switched from the Julian calendar to the Gregorian calendar which advanced the calendar 10 days-as called for by the Council of Trent-and moved the start of the new year to January 1st. In the Julian Calendar, the new year began with the spring equinox around April 1st. People who were slow to get the news or failed to recognize that the start of the new year had moved and continued to celebrate it during the last week of March through April 1 became the butt of jokes and hoaxes and were called "April fools." These pranks included having paper fish placed on their backs and being referred to as "April fish" said to symbolize a young, easily caught fish and a gullible person.
